Dear friends and family,

Psalm 118:14 The Lord is my strength and my song; he has become my salvation.

It is summer, and the hills are brown and dry – but lives are lush and fruitful! We are so excited to share with you about some of those lives!

We have had several youth activities – at the beach, Ultimate Frisbee on the field, watching "The Chosen" and the young people are excited! A couple of those young people are Pedro and Emily. They came from a state in the south of Mexico with their parents, escaping from the cartel.

At first, the family was forced to pay "protection" money, then later the father of the family was forced to work for them. Then the cartel wanted their teen aged kids to work for them – and if they did not, they would pay with their lives. (This is the second of three families that have escaped from this same state and first found refuge in our neighborhood and church, and second in receiving Jesus as their Lord and Savior).

On the first Sunday in Ensenada, Hector, the father, received the Lord. The following Sunday, Mayra, the mother and three kids; Pedro, Emily and Karen accepted Jesus! They joined our marriage group and continued with a six-month commitment to a class on Inner Healing taught by fellow missionary, Allyson Searway. As we watch them grow, it is amazing to see the freedom that they are living – in every way. They had been emotionally, physically, and spiritually held captive and now they are FREE! The joy that they express is contagious! Recently we had baptisms and their whole family (except for little Karen), were

all baptized! What a day! What a celebration.






Hector, Mayra, Emily, Pedro, and another church member, Lily were baptized in July!


Last week we were privileged to serve alongside ST. BARNABAS | MAYO CLINIC | RLC & FRIENDS MEXICO MEDICAL MISSION as they blessed Ensenada with their service of love to the poorer communities. It was the first time to serve together since 2019 after 24 years of continuous service. The Covid crisis kept us apart temporarily, but this year was a celebration of being back together to serve our community.



A few statistics! There were many specialties brought—general med, cardiology, pediatrics, gynecology, psychology, dental and optometry. There was also a station for hair cutting and a commissary for giving out basic needed items.

There were 48 on the U.S. team and 46 of us on the Ensenada team! During the four clinic days, all specialties combined, we saw 1,100 patients.

This week we had a group visiting from Valley Community Church in Pleasanton, CA. The main group worked in another part of town building a house! The first part of the week two of the men came and worked alongside Pablo to repair and re-roof a couple of our stand-alone Sunday school rooms. On Thursday we took our youth group to meet up with them at the beach for a bonfire with hotdogs and smores, a devotional and fellowship! Friday morning the whole group came to the church to do some finish work on the roof project, to paint and to take a couple

of blessing baskets to two needy families in our



church.



And in between all the activity – the celebrations of God's salvation, goodness, and generosity, we are preparing for Cuba!!



Jacob went ahead of us, leaving July 4th and will be

there two months before our arrival. He is working with the leadership there, preparing for the DTI and Couples conferences – getting food and supplies, visiting, and encouraging churches that have been through the training, serving wherever needed.



Once again, we will travel with our leaders, Frank and Jeannette Meitz.

working with our Cuban leadership as they prepare for the general sessions that they will be leading. This is something new – for each of them to teach a general session, as well as the breakout groups. (A lot of preparation was done for this last year as we translated the prompt notes on the PowerPoint slides).

Our team will arrive three days before the conference to join with our Cuban Leadership Team to continue to equip and encourage them in their ongoing and fruitful discipleship efforts. These pre-conference reunions are a celebration of sharing what God is doing in all of our lives and ministries.

Pastors and leaders from Havana are the focus for this trainer's event. They will travel the 170 miles from Havana to Palmira to the conference center. Even now they are trying to reserve their tickets on public transportation, as demand is more than supply, and fuel is uncertain.

Inflation in Cuba is 45% higher in 2023 than last year... ... and in 2022 was 39% greater than the year before! That means food, gasoline, electricity, and water are in short supply, and now cost MUCH MORE -- when they can get these necessities. In fact, daily staples -- such as bread and milk, flour, sugar, salt... are in short supply.

We are praying that we have enough gasoline to run a generator (gifted to the Church) to provide the Conference Center with electricity, due to the unpredictable daily rolling blackouts. This means preparation for the conference is extremely complicated and will cost SIGNIFICANTLY MORE than any previous conference. Whereas before COVID, \$10 would pay for one attendee for the WEEK, this year, food alone will cost a minimum of \$10 / DAY.

This is also true of the couples' conference that will be held the following week. Pray for us as we prepare personally for our teaching at both conferences. Pray for the finances needed. We have our plane tickets, but we only have about half of what we need for the couples' conference. God is our provider, He is our Salvation, He is generous, and He is good. We invite you to join us in prayer and in financial gifts for these endeavors.


