Dear friends and family,

We are so happy to send autumn greetings from our house to yours! It has been an amazing year of growth, of activity, of renewed energy and conviction!

As you know we were on sabbatical from April through June. We rested. We studied. We got outside and hiked! We visited supporters and family – people we hadn't touched base with, in person, for many years – and it was an amazing time. We are so thankful for that long moment of respite.

We returned to Mexico and within days were deep into summer activity! With summer come groups of people from the U.S. to do all kinds of service projects. We are so privileged to be a part of that! Hebrews 13:16 says: "And don't forget to do good and to share with those in need. These are the sacrifices that please God". As we walked beside our U.S. visitors, we walked as co-laborers in service to those in need. What a privilege!

Mary Beth from St. Barnabas Medical Mission came down a week early to prep for the clinic activities and stayed at our



home. We also had a group down from Texas who we joined up with one evening on the beach and our men's group and their families ate dinner together and had a great time of worship and testimonies. Mary Beth got to see this other part of our ministry so we were doubly blessed!

St. Barnabas Medical Mission also filled prescriptions for an additional 38 adults, 12 children and a supply of prenatal vitamins and hospital supplies

hospital supplies that were taken to Cuba in August when Jacob & Elianet went with their children's ministry "Con una Sonrisa" to serve on the island.

Sunday, July 13th, 33 doctors, nurses and assistants arrived in Ensenada and met up with a team of 35 local doctors, dentists, optometrists, pharmacists, translators, and helpers making a total of 68

people on our 2025 team! We served two rural communities as well as one center city site and we watched as Jesus touched bodies, eyes and teeth with medical, optical and dental ministries – helping those most needy in our city.



The following week, our dear friends from



Pleasanton, CA joined us in reroofing one of our church buildings. Mid-week we took our youth group for

a bonfire on the beach and they played soccer, ate together and shared testimonies. The

baskets" to three
families that
were all going





through really tough times. They were blessed with food, cleaning and hygiene items and a sweet time of visiting and praying together.

The final week of July we took a group of young people to our mission in Colonet and (as a practice run for the program that Jacob and Elianet were taking to Cuba), they led our youth in the preparations for and the carrying out of a three-day VBS program. It was amazing!

The children were engaged in the program – but even more significant was the growth and the showing of their love for Jesus as they prayed with us each day. Each afternoon, the children were fed and then we moved on to work projects – repairing much needed things on the building that had fallen into disrepair since 2020. (This trip was sponsored by Taft Avenue Community Church in Orange, CA).





Life has settled back into a routine since summer has ended! Pablo is having a great time with the men's group. They are watching the first season of "The Chosen" and having very deep conversations after each episode. For the last year they have been studying the book of Acts in depth and so putting it all together has been though provoking.



A soccer tournament went throughout the summer months and now a brand-new tournament will begin in a week. Please pray for Pablo. There have been incredible difficulties on the field as tempers have flared and people have been hurt and the coaches and refs are dealing with a new type of lack of self-control that

has been showing itself on the field. One of Pablo's players kicked another player in the face and broke his nose. This same player is in trouble with this same type of behavior on a league downtown. He has been suspended from this coming tournament and that is very hard. We want to see these kids















succeed in every area of their lives. His name is Christian. We have worked with him since he was in grade school. Pray for him – that during this time of "discipline" and disappointment that he would learn from these mistakes that he has made. Pablo just talked to him, giving him the news that he has been suspended and he is not happy. Pablo will be walking with him during this time. He realizes that what he has done is not a good example to his own teenage son. He wants to change but WE KNOW that that can only happen if he is open to Jesus in his life. Pray with us for Christian.

Martha has begun teaching ESL again to high schoolers and adults in our community. She has 22 students and is in her sixth week of Level 1 classes. The students are excited to learn and are working hard! It is a wonderful thing to



be able to open the door to better employment opportunities as they learn. There is one student that rides the bus 2 ½ hours each way to come to the 3 ½ hour class each week! She just graduated with a bachelor's in international business administration but doesn't know English! Her goal is to go on



and get her master's and knowing English will be an incredible asset.

Beloved Cuba...both here at home and far away...

As you may remember, a young man, Moises came to live with us two years ago. He had made the journey from Cuba to Nicaragua to Ensenada, requesting political asylum in Mexico which was

granted. For a time, he left our home but has been living with us again since August. His wife, Claudia and children were just granted asylum, and they will fly on December 13th to join Moises and once again be a family! They will live with us for the first few months until they get settled.





In the meantime, another couple also made the trek from Cuba to Nicaragua to Mexico. After being granted temporary asylum in the U.S., the husband continued on while his wife waited in Mexico City for her legalization. A year and a half later, when his paperwork was not renewed and his work permit expired, he moved from Las

Vegas, and she flew from Mexico DF to start their new life together in Ensenada. It just so happens that we know her mother, who works at the ministry center in Palmira (our ministry base in Cuba). They have rented a house here on our hill as well!

So, in December when Claudia and the kids arrive, there will be seven Cubans in our lives, right here in our corner of Mexico. The two families have nothing as it pertains to furniture and even the bare necessities – so, because we are so close to the border, we have begun to look at Craigslist for kitchen items, the simplest of furniture, linens, etc, to aid these families who have left their lives behind in Cuba. If any of you would like to donate to this cause - either by sending items or donating money for us to buy furniture and other items for them, please let us know.

Thinking about our family today I realized, Ben and Jeanelle have been married 15 years!
